

Get ready for open enrollment.

Open enrollment starts Nov. 1, 2022.

1. Know the key dates.

- Nov. 1, 2022 – Jan. 15, 2023, is the Open Enrollment period when you can purchase individual and family plans on and off the Marketplace.
- Enroll by Dec. 15, 2022, to have coverage begin Jan. 1, 2023, as long as your premium is paid.

There are times outside Open Enrollment where you can apply for coverage.

2. Review your options.

Chorus Community Health Plans 2023 plans are available on our website at chorushealthplans.org/2023-Plan-Options. Pricing for these plans will be available starting Nov. 1, 2022.

Chorus Community Health Plans offers 13 plans, including Bronze and Silver copay plans with \$0 deductibles, a High Deductible HSA qualified plan, and an off-exchange only Silver Choice plan. The Silver Choice plan can be purchased directly at chorushealthplans.org as you cannot use advanced premium tax credits or cost-share reduction benefits offered through the Marketplace.

NEW FOR 2023! Chorus Community Health Plans expands into Sheboygan County and added Prevea and HSHS to the network.

Chorus Community Health Plans also offers three stand-alone dental plans you can enroll in separately in select counties.

3. Prepare your info.

When you apply for or renew your coverage, you'll need to provide some information about you and your household, including:

- The names and Social Security numbers of every household member
- Household income
- Employer information for each person in your household
- How you file your federal income taxes
- Immigrant document information (if applicable)

4. Ask for help.
